

Back-to-back conferences with OSCE, 01-04 Memorandum of Understanding (MoU) with First Meeting of the Southern Africa Regional Moldova, 17 November: UNOCT and the Informal Working Group (IWG), 24 November: CT Republic of Moldova signed an MoU Travel, organized a two-day IWG meeting for 34 formalizing their partnership to strengthen delegates representing law enforcement, counterterrorist fighters, focusing on supporting States cooperation in preventing and countering terrorism, security, and civil aviation agencies

## **Capacity Building**

Training: Three UNOCT-led training took place: one for Namibia (API and PNR Interactive Training Course), one for Botswana (goTravel basic user training), and finally one for the participants of the SCO RATS (Regional Training).

**Operational:** UNODC/AIRCOP undertook five study visits: Moldova to Latvia (virtual), Côte D'Ivoire to France, Iraq to Romania, Moldova to Romania, and Azerbaijan to Norway. Additionally, eight operational working group meetings were organized, four of which focused on PIU ToR drafting in Azerbaijan x2, Mongolia, and Namibia.

provided UNODC/TPB legislative assistance, and reviewed the passenger data legal and/or regulatory frameworks of four beneficiary Member States, namely Botswana, Côte d'Ivoire, The Gambia, and Switzerland. 20 Legal Working Group meetings were held throughout the quarter.

IOM: Held four meetings promoting CT Travel across three countries, and a plenary meeting for AIRPOL. Three different coordination briefings with IOM field offices and provided support to Programme activities in Djibouti (Legal), and Moldova (Study Visits).

Transport Industry: ICAO held eight working group meetings with different beneficiary countries as well as one connectivity meeting with Mongolia.

Technical: UNOICT held 11 working group meetings focusing on goTravel deployment or installation, and another 17 meetings or interactions regarding software maintenance support. 27 IT support tickets were received, of which OICT responded to 26 from Member States with MoAs, and to one with Member State without an MoA during this period. A total of 17 tickets were resolved, and 10 tickets are in progress.

### **About CT Travel**

The objective of the UN CT Travel Programme is to build Member States' capabilities to prevent, detect and investigate terrorist offenses and other serious crimes, including related travel, by:

- Collecting and analyzing travel information such as passenger data, namely Advance Passenger Information (API) and Passenger Name Record (PNR);
- Improving the use of international databases with known and suspected terrorists and criminals, such as the databases of the International Criminal Police Organization (INTERPOL); and
- Enhancing international information exchange, in line with UN Security Council resolutions 2178, 2396, and 2482.

The detection capabilities, commonly referred to as Passenger Information Units (PIUs), that the Programme helps establish are in charge of processing passenger data provided by the transport industry using the UN 'goTravel' software solution, based on solid legislation and regulations established with the Programme's assistance.

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## **Executive Summary | Key Successes in Numbers**

Throughout quarter four, CT Travel held 32 engagements, including seven All Pillar Country coordination meetings with national focal points, that were held with all partners. Throughout the same quarter, CT Travel also met with two international organizations, CEPOL (with two regional workshops delivered), and WCO to discuss possible areas of cooperation, with additional 16 Bilateral coordination meetings across 13 Member States, another three maritime-focused meetings, and a Steering Committee meeting with the EU, in addition to seven internal coordination meetings, with an overall of 17 communication products (press releases/web stories/tweets) were published during this period.



October: One SCO-RATS regional training was held on 24-27 October, and one interactive training for Namibia was held on 9 October.

December: One MoA was signed with Mongolia on 2 December, a study visit for <u>Moldavian</u> officials to the Romanians PIU was organized on 9 December, another study visit for Azerbaijani officials to Norway PIU was organized on 17 December, <u>INTERPOL-ICAO</u> Passenger data seminar took place on 19 December.



November: Two seminars by OSCE and UNOCT on the use of passenger data were held from 1 to 4 November in Vienna, one national consultation with Benin took place on 4 November, and with Kyrgyzstan on 30 November, one MoU was signed with Moldova on 17 November, one goTravel user basic training was held in **Botswana** on November 23rd, the first meeting of the Southern Africa Regional Informal Working Group (IWG) took place on 24 November, followed by the PIU inauguration in Botswana on 23 November.

## Building Sustainable Regional Approaches to API and PNR Implementation —

Regional Informal Working Groups (IWGs)

- West Africa IWG: One virtual meeting involving 63 experts from 13 Member States, supplemented by virtual thematics across all four pillars.
- Southern Africa IWG: First in-person meeting took place in Botswana involving 65 experts from 12 Member States.
- Eastern Europe IWG: Second in-person meeting took place with 33 experts from 13 Member States.

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### **Training Approach**

CT Travel Programme has a variety of training courses available for Member States:

- CT Travel Foundational course covering four eLearning modules on the basics of API and PNR, the international legal framework, a PIU and a Passenger Data Single Window, and Hit and Match, delivered self-paced online;
- An Interactive <u>CT Travel Training course</u> delivered in-person or hybrid over four-five days and covering all key aspects of the Programme;
- A Specialised Rules Based-Targeting Training designed for operators and analysts in the Passenger Information Unit;
- A goTravel-user basic training designed to apply the RBT training in the goTravel system; and
- A Technical IT training on the deployment and installation of goTravel.

CT Travel Training Delivery: Three Member States enrolled online for the Foundational course for Moldova, Norway, and Togo. Two interactive CT Travel training courses for Moldova and Togo, and one Specialised Rules-based Targeting Training for Norway.

CT Travel Training Development: Development of new eLearning and microlearning modules, on (i) Maritime, (ii) Human Rights, (iii) goTravel.
