Overview

- 130 million young people with disabilities
- Starting an independent livelihood is more difficult for YWD because they frequently remain invisible to employment, educational and youth transition policies.
- YWD are less likely to be in school
- Lower transition rates to HE
- Market oriented transitions and large public sector reforms and YWD

YWD in Development: Barriers

- SG report "the adolescents and youth of today are central to realizing development that is sustainable and equitable."
- But, PWD excluded in 2000 MDG
- PWD face barriers in accessing development programmes and funds
- 80% of PWD live in developing world, 4% benefit from international cooperation
- Development efforts continue to finance projects not in line with CRPD

YWD in Development: Good news

- 112 Member States ratified the CRPD.
- CRPD envisions responsibilities of States Parties towards international cooperation in its article 32.
- Several UN resolutions have highlighted disability as a development goal.
- High Level Meeting on Disability and Development.
- Disability as a cross-cutting issue

Recommendations

- Disaggregation of data and the collection of new datasets on disability (and youth)
- <u>Recognition of disability in the next MDG</u>
- Disability markers
- <u>Mainstreaming of disability in the work of</u> <u>UN agencies</u>: UNDP, UNWOMEN, UNICEF and UNFPA. Disability to be recognized in their strategic plans.
