Irregular rainfall in central and southern

Mozambique created a crop-killing drought,
leaving farmers with no harvest to support their
families. (10)

OSVALDO AND MOTHER IN DRY FIELD Here in Tenga, some 80 kilometres west of Maputo, fields are dry, and the maize crop has shrivelled before it could ripen.

Osvaldo's mother, 48-year-old Lea Oracio Zimba, is a widow struggling to feed her six children.

"This year, we have a drought. But since the children attend school, they get some food there."

WOMEN COLLECTING GREEN LEAVES

A joint crop assessment by WFP and the Food and Agricultural Organization, FAO, estimates that the drought will cut cereal production in Mozambique by 3%. As a result more than half a million people face food shortages. Among them are 57-year-old Delvina Banze and her family. (22)

"We have nothing. Everything is dry. This is why

I am collecting these green leaves in order to

WFP WAREHOUSE This warehouse looks full but these stacks of

70,000 metric tons of emergency relief to feed all
