## **STATEMENT**

Mr. Chair,

I have the honour and great pleasure to introduce the report of the 2020 session of the Special Committee on the Charter of the United Nations and on the Strengthening of the Role of the Organization, contained in Supplement No. 33 (A/75/33).

The Special Committee met in New York from 18 to 26 February 2020 and continued its deliberations on the questions mandated by General Assembly resolution 74/190.

Allow me now to take you through the Report, which consists of five chapters and three annexes. The first of these chapters is entirely procedural. Paragraphs 11 to 13 list all items and proposals that were under consideration by the Special Committee.

Chapter II of the Report relates to the **maintenance of international peace and security**. Paragraphs 15 to 16 pertain to general comments on the topic. Sections A to F of Chapter II then set out the Special Committee's consideration of a number of items under the topic.

Section A of Chapter II covers the work of the Special Committee on the question of the implementation of the provisions of the Charter relating to assistance to third States affected by the application of sanctions. Paragraphs 17 to 18 of the Report reflect the Special Committee's discussion on this question. As requested in paragraph 5 of resolution 74/190, the Special Committee was briefed by the Secretariat on developments relating to paragraph 13 of the report of the Secretary-General (A/74/152). A summary of the briefing can be found at paragraph 19 of the Report.

The Special Committee also addressed the question of the **introduction and implementation of sanctions imposed by the United Nations**, as set out in Section B of Chapter II. Paragraphs 20 to 24 of the Report reflect the consideration in the Special Committee on this question. As requested in paragraph 4 of resolution 74/190, the Special Committee was briefed by the Secretariat on the document entitled "Introduction and implementation of sanctions imposed by the United Nations", annexed to General Assembly resolution 64/115. A

summary of the briefing and the following discussion in the Special Committee can be found at paragraphs 25 to 30 of the Report.

Section C of Chapter II, at paragraphs 31 to 33, reflects the Special Committee's consideration of the revised proposal submitted by Libya with a view to strengthening the role of the United Nations in the maintenance of international peace and security.

Section D of Chapter II, at paragraphs 34 to 37, summarizes the discussion on the revised working paper submitted by Belarus and the Russian Federation concerning the **request for an advisory opinion from the International Court of Justice** as to the legal consequences of the resort to the use of force by States without prior authorization by the Security Council, except in the exercise of the right to self-defense.

Section E of Chapter II, at paragraphs 38 to 41, deals with the consideration of the revised working paper submitted by Cuba on the strengthening of the role of the Organization and enhancing its effectiveness: adoption of recommendations.

The last section of Chapter II, Section F, at paragraphs 42 to 45, covers the work of the Special Committee on the further revised working paper submitted by Ghana on **strengthening** the relationship and cooperation between the United Nations and regional arrangements or agencies in the peaceful settlement of disputes.

Mr. Chair,

I turn now to Chapter III of the Report, which deals with the item on the **peaceful** settlement of disputes. Paragraphs 46 to 52 pertain to general comments on the topic.

Section A of Chapter III covers the Special Committee's annual thematic debate on the means for the settlement of disputes, on the subtopic, "Exchange of information on State practices regarding the use of conciliation". A summary of the debate can be found at paragraphs

53 to 58. Paragraph 59 of the Report reflects the recommendation of the Special Committee that the thematic debate for the next session be on the subtopic "Exchange of information on State practices regarding the use of arbitration".

Section B of Chapter III, at paragraphs 60 to 62, summarizes the discussion on the Russian Federation's proposal recommending that the Secretariat be requested to establish a website dedicated to the peaceful settlement of disputes between States and update the 1992 Handbook on the Peaceful Settlement of Disputes between States.

Chapter IV of the Report, from paragraphs 63 to 74, summarizes the Special Committee's discussion on the *Repertory of Practice of United Nations Organs* and the *Repertoire of the Practice of the Security Council*. The Special Committee was briefed by the Secretariat on the status of the *Repertory* and the *Repertoire*. The recommendations of the Special Committee on this item are set out in paragraph 75 of the Report.

Finally, Mr. Chair,

Chapter V of the Report concerns the consideration of the remaining items on the agenda of the Special Committee. Section A, at paragraphs 76 to 81, reflects a summary of the discussion on the working methods of the Special Committee.

Section B concerns the **identification of new subjects**. Paragraphs 82 and 83 pertain to general comments on the topic. Paragraphs 84 to 94 summarize the discussion on specific proposals for the inclusion of new subjects, including the written proposals submitted respectively by Mexico, the Islamic Republic of Iran and the Syrian Arab Republic, which are reproduced in annexes I to III to the report, and the oral proposal made by Cuba.
